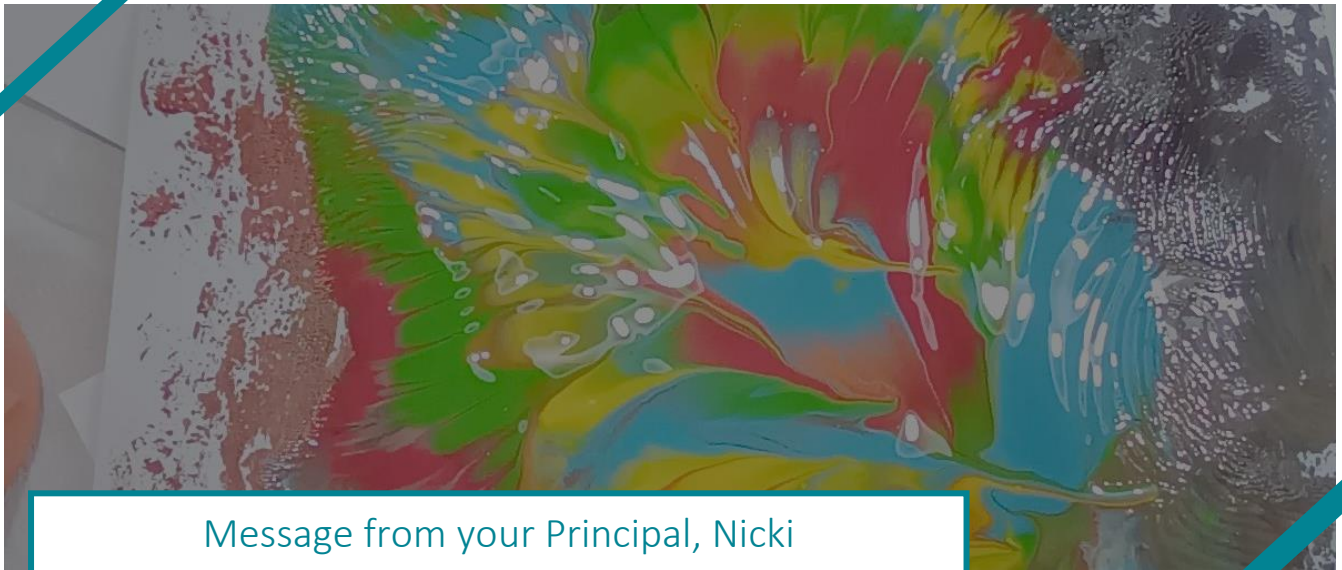




EGHAM PARK SCHOOL

We hope that you have a lovely Easter Break.



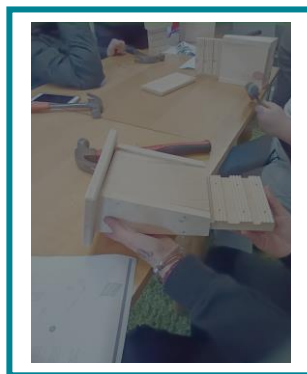
Theatrical Make Up Artist- World Book Day

British Red Cross

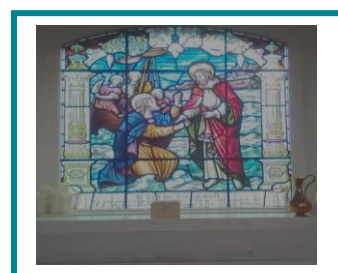

St Johns Church Egham

The pupils from Egham Park School went on a visit to St. John's church in Egham. Whilst there, they learnt about the history of the church, how the interior and layout has changed over time, as well as hearing about all the community activities that take place at St. John's. The group also visited the crypt beneath the church and explored the church grounds.



Egham Museum

This term pupils visited Egham Museum with an opportunity to explore local history. In a talk they learnt about local history, from early settlements during the Bronze Age, to the signing of the Magna Carta. Through museum displays pupils explored Egham during the World Wars and local industry, like the Lagonda Car Factory on the Causeway in Staines.

The pupils put on their gloves and grabbed the black bags and helped pick litter to keep Britain tidy! We were very lucky to have a collaboration with Royal Holloway University and had 3 volunteers help the pupils. The pupils pledged and collected 5 bags of rubbish from the car park next door to us and local streets.



Strodes College Science Lab

The Key Stage 4 students have been enjoying their time at Strode's College working in the Science Laboratories with the help of Strode's Lab Assistant Lily Smerdon. We have gained an AQA Certificate in Laboratory Safety and Risk Assessment as well as conducting Chemistry practical experiments. We have investigated Acids and Alkalis as well as making Copper Sulphate crystals. We have investigated chromatography using the inks we use every day in school. Our final experiment this term was involved with the fermentation process using yeast and glucose. Next term we will start Physics work starting with electricity.

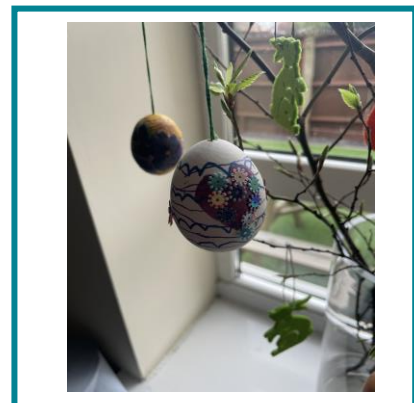
